Ever wondered how a small town like Bollington has such a vibrant and diverse Festival? It's thanks to the vision and commitment of Dr John Coope MBE and the enthusiasm of local volunteers. Dr Coope was a GP in the town for many years and in the 1960s set out to revitalise its community spirit by initiating social, musical and

The first Bollington Festival, led by Dr Coope, was held in September 1964. Events included "a Dance to two Beat Groups" in the marquee (tickets 4 shillings), a bowls tournament and a horticultural show. Since then the Festival – sometimes themed – has been held every four to seven years and has featured world-famous entertainers, a genuine Victorian helter-skelter, donkey rides, overseas performers and... Bollington's very own Calendar Boys, as seen on The Graham Norton Show! The Festival has always renewed excitement in local community groups and spawned new ones; for example the inclusion of science events for the first time in 2009 gives us a thriving SciBar in Bollington five years later. Although our Bollington Festival has evolved and grown to include over 100 activities in 2014, one thing remains the same: the aim to involve and inspire the community, just as Dr Coope envisaged 50 years ago.
